

Structures Contained In This Edifice

A. Gate

Gates are common throughout Asia in palaces. Serves as a sign of welcome

B. Bee Ryong Bong

- i. Staff of the flying dragon
- ii. Songham Taekwondo's most valued artifact
- iii. From bottom to top, contains pictorial history of Songahm Taekwondo
- iv. Sculpted in Hot Springs, Arkansas by David and Bre Harris of Arkansas Light & Time Design
- v. To serve as a downtown respite

C. Fountain

- i. Nine feet tall (9 & 3 are significant numbers in Asian culture)
- ii. Fountain contains three bowls:
 1. Top Bowl: Three dragon heads
 2. Middle bowl: Six dragon claws
 3. Bottom bowl: Nine Songahm stars

D. Wall of Vision

- i. Located behind bust of Eternal Grand Master Lee
- ii. Names of ATA Masters and Master level donors
- iii. 11 feet tall
- iv. Made from Chinese black granite, built by South Korean artist

E. Statue of fu dogs

- i. Guardians of the Garden's entrance

F. Statue of turtles

- i. One big turtle and eight small ones
- ii. Made of polished granite
- iii. Two feet tall, three feet wide, four feet long
- iv. Symbolize long life. Nine turtles together symbolize the unity and strength of family

G. Statue of an ATA male student and an ATA female student, both bowing

- i. Located in area just behind gate, one of first things people see
- ii. Bowing represents greeting and respect
- iii. Each six feet tall
- iv. Wearing ATA uniforms
